

Job Growth Among the Slowest of Any Administration in over 70 Years





Change in Private Nonfarm Employment



Seasonally Adjusted, March 2005 - March 2008



Civilian Unemployment Rate





Civilian Unemployment





People Unemployed More than 26 Weeks









Bush Administration Projections of Public Debt in 2008





Average Amount of 2001-2006 Tax Cuts by Household Income, 2007





*Real Median Family Income





Real Household Income Has Declined for All Except the Richest since 2000




Note: Each quintile contains 20 percent of households ranked by household income.

One of Four Administrations with an Average Annual Rise in the Poverty Rate





Number of People in Poverty




