

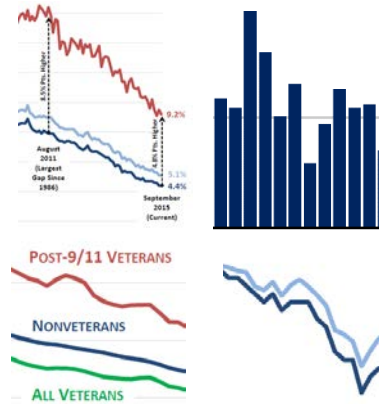

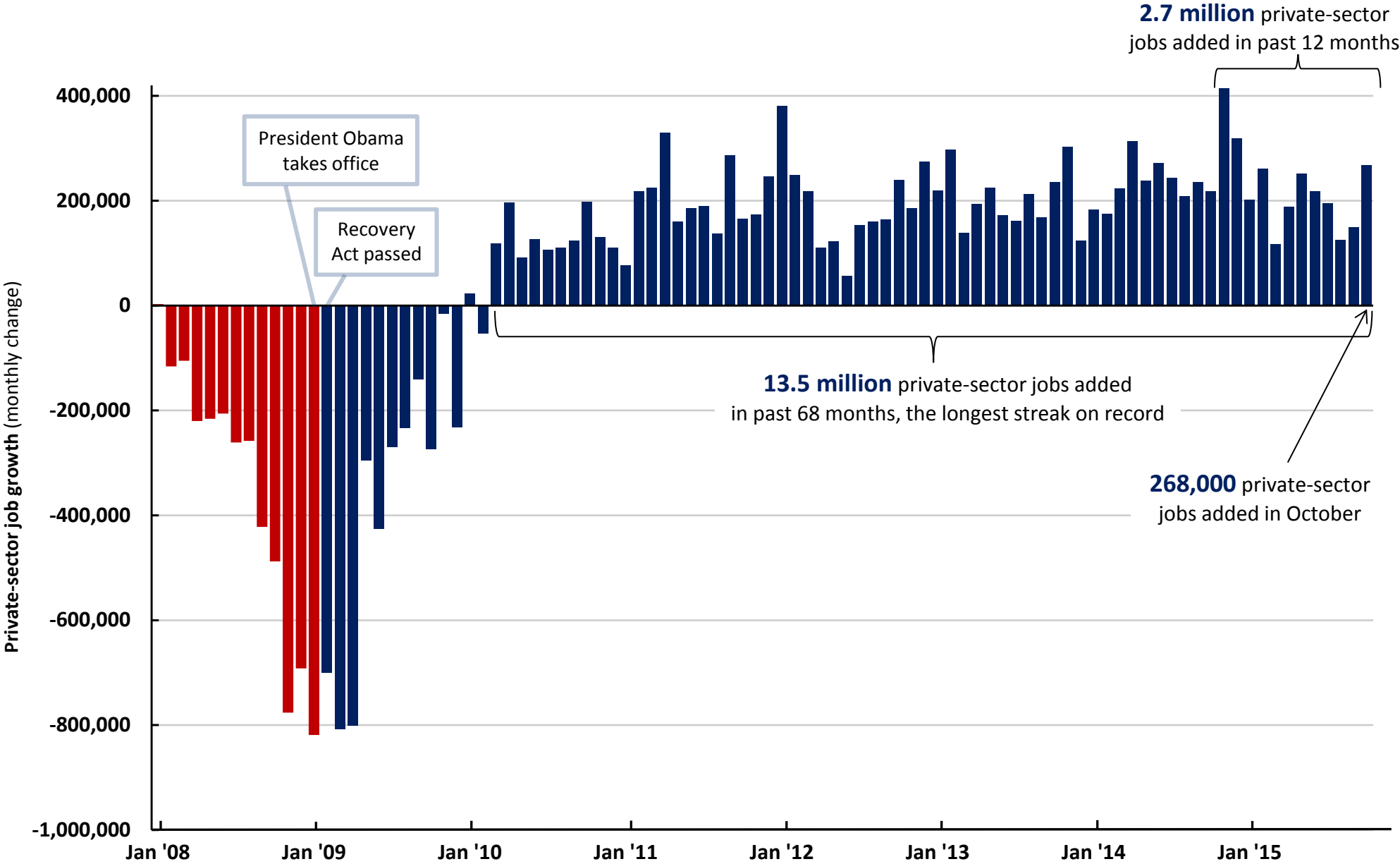

# Private-Sector Job Growth Continues in October

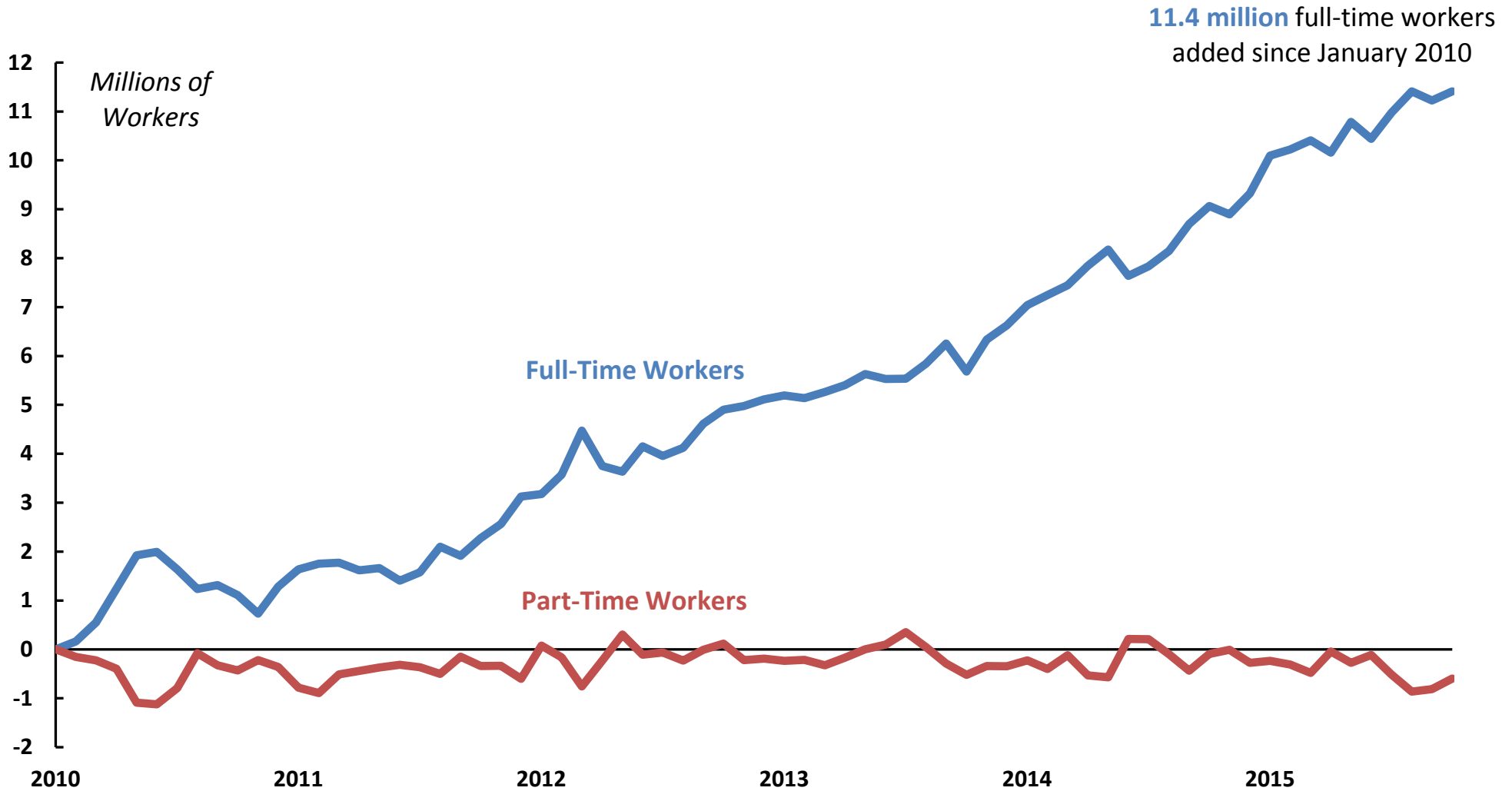

Net change in employment, January 2010 to October 2015

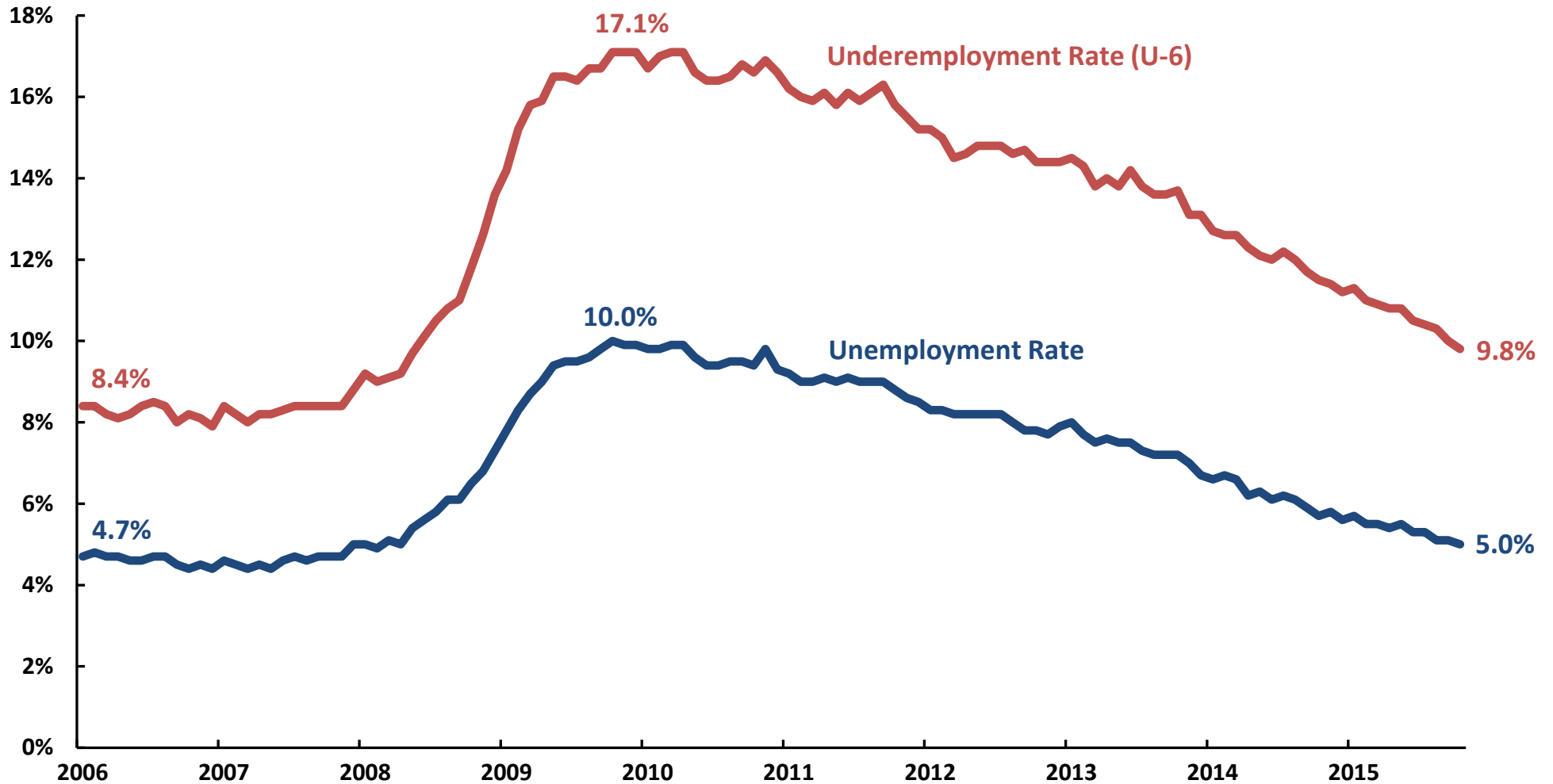

January 2006 to October 2015



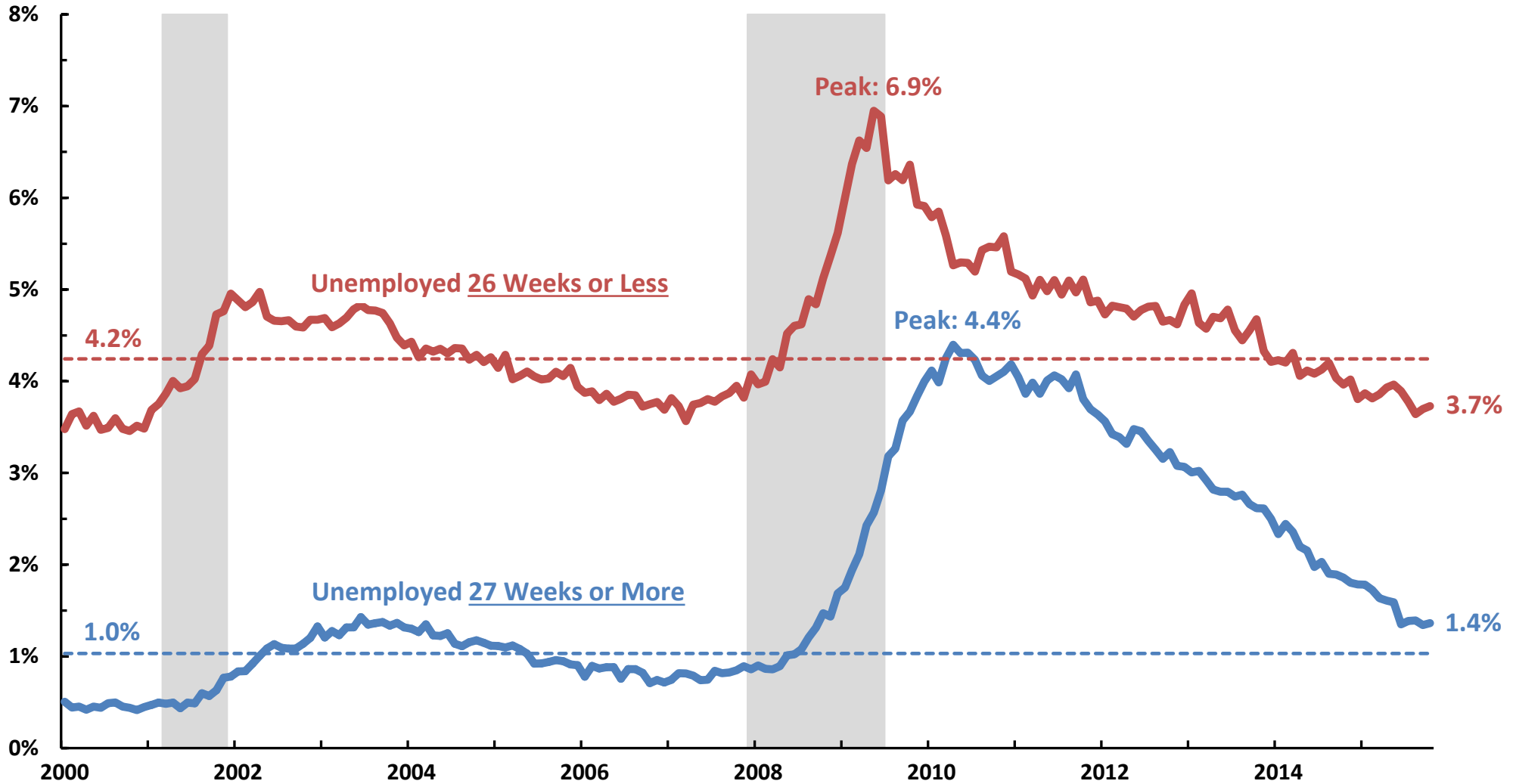

# Declines in Short- and Long-Term Unemployment

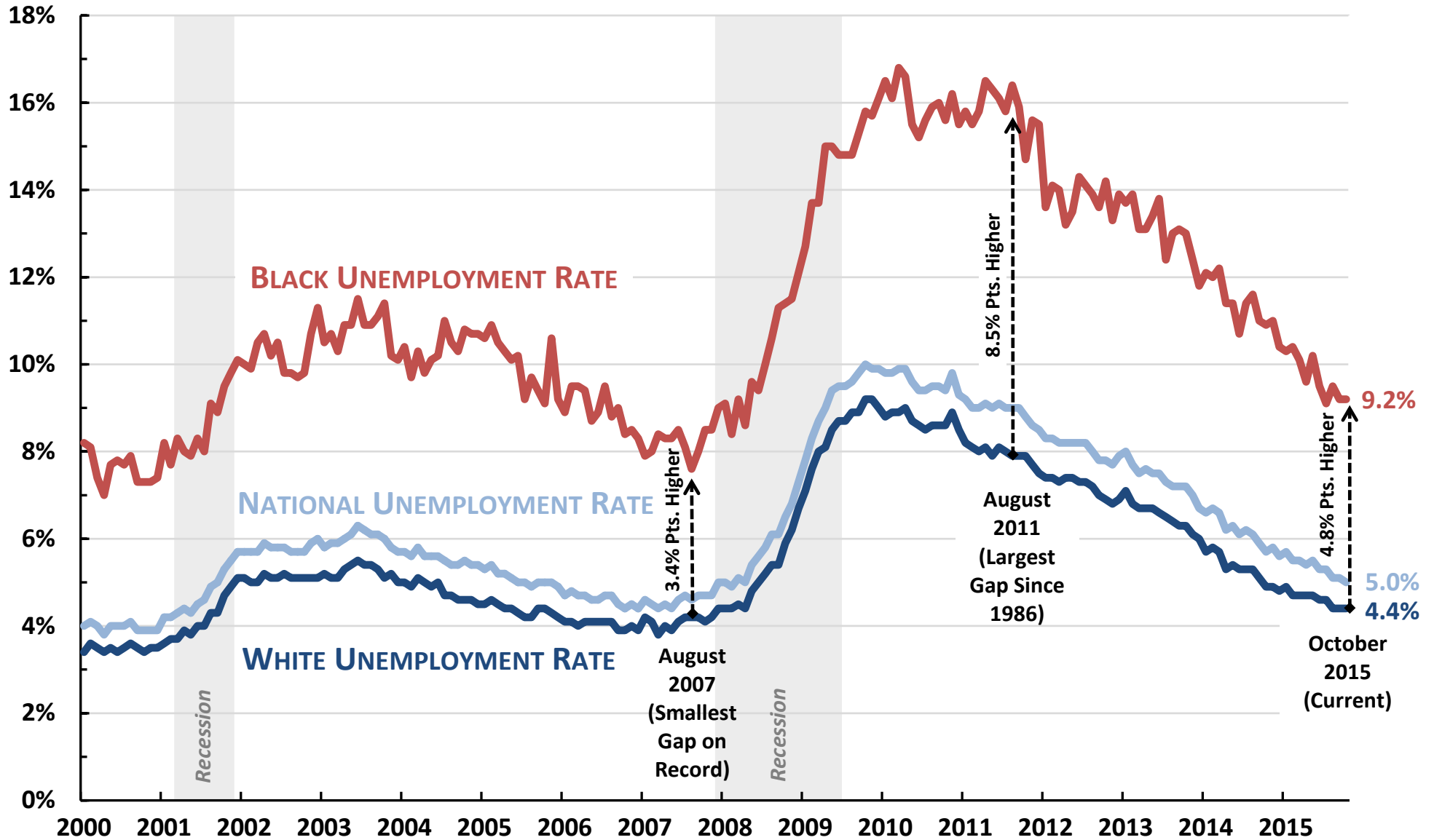
Percent of the labor force unemployed by duration, January 2000 to October 2015

# Black vs. White Unemployment



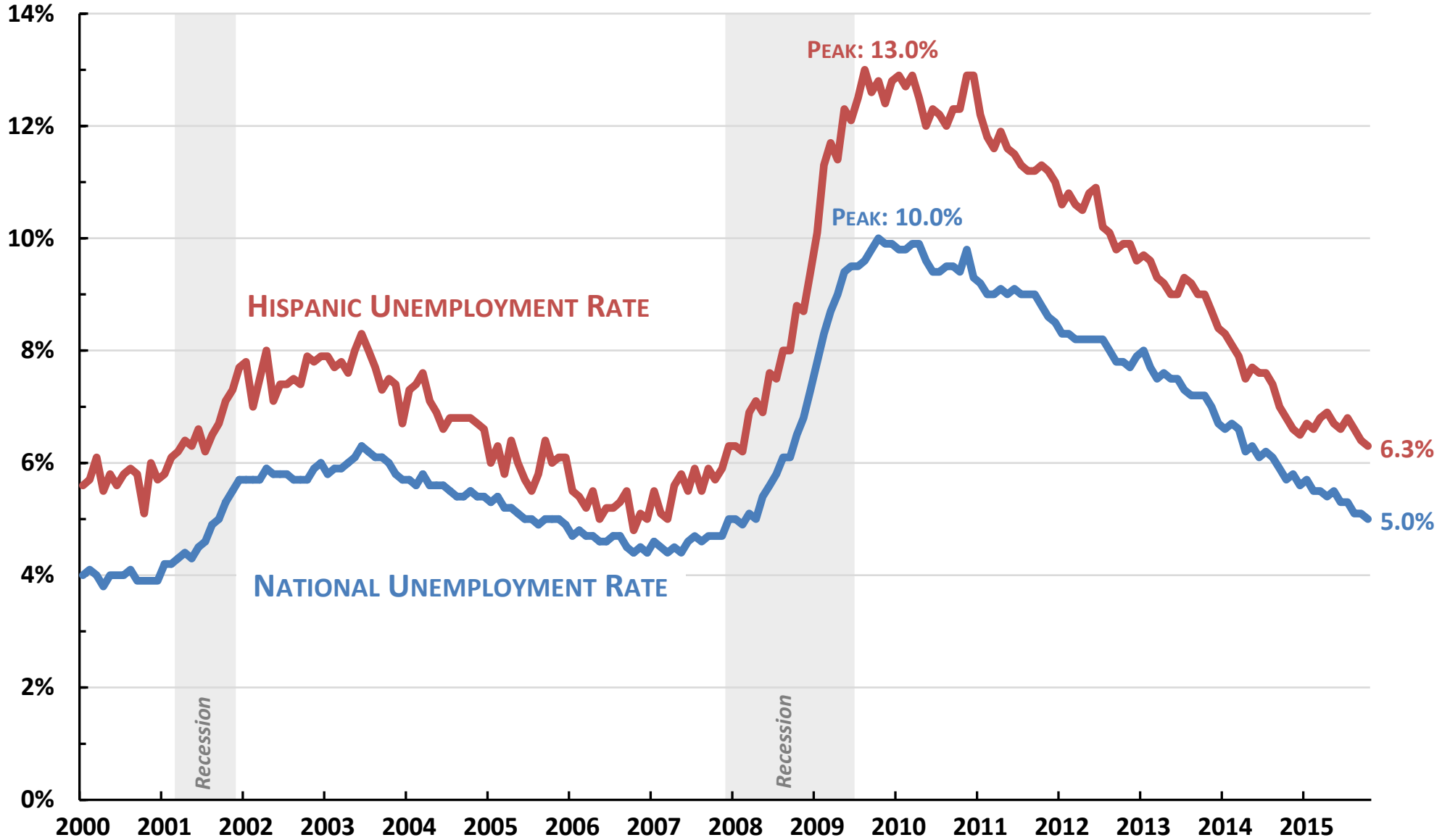

January 2000 to October 2015

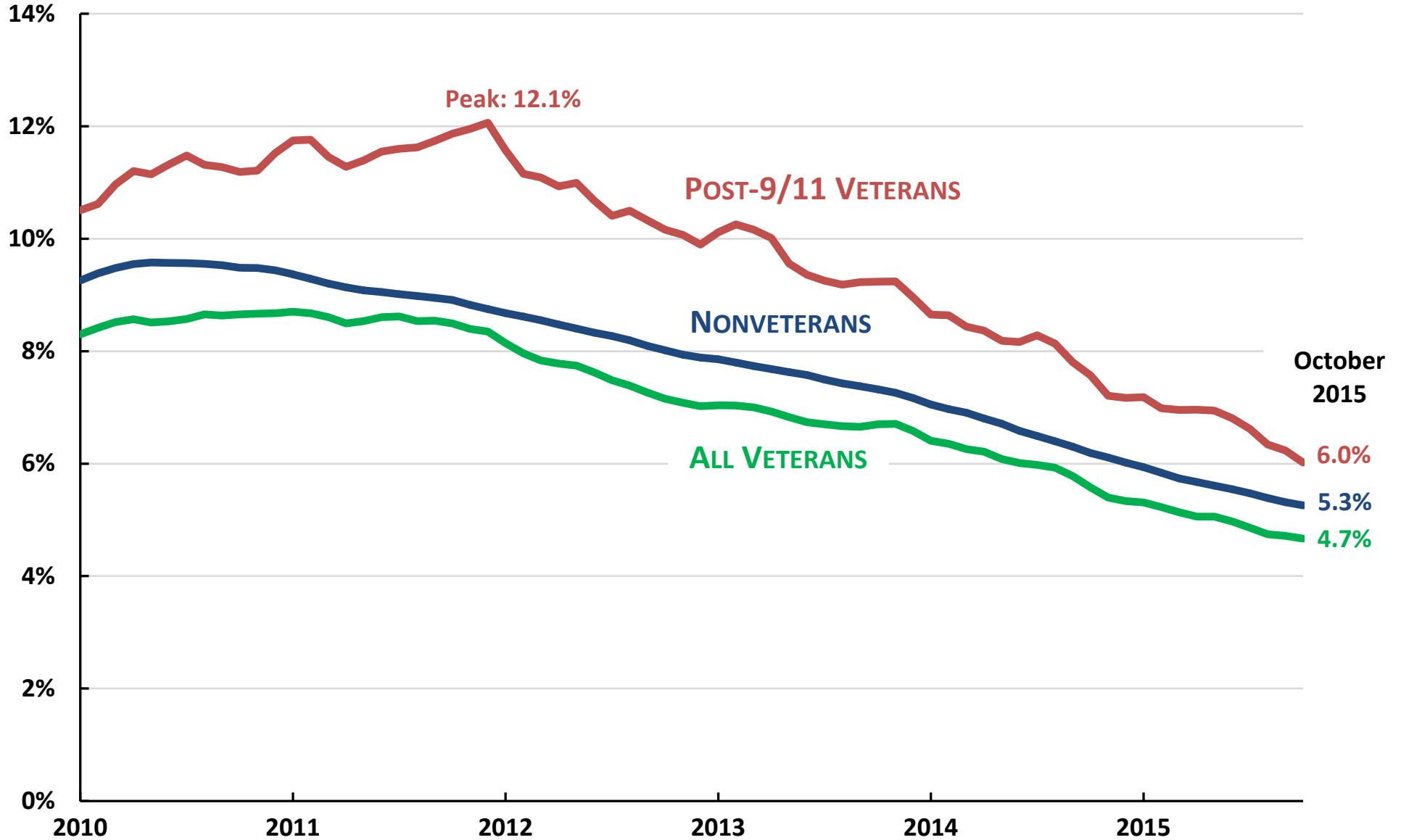

12-month moving averages, January 2010 to October 2015

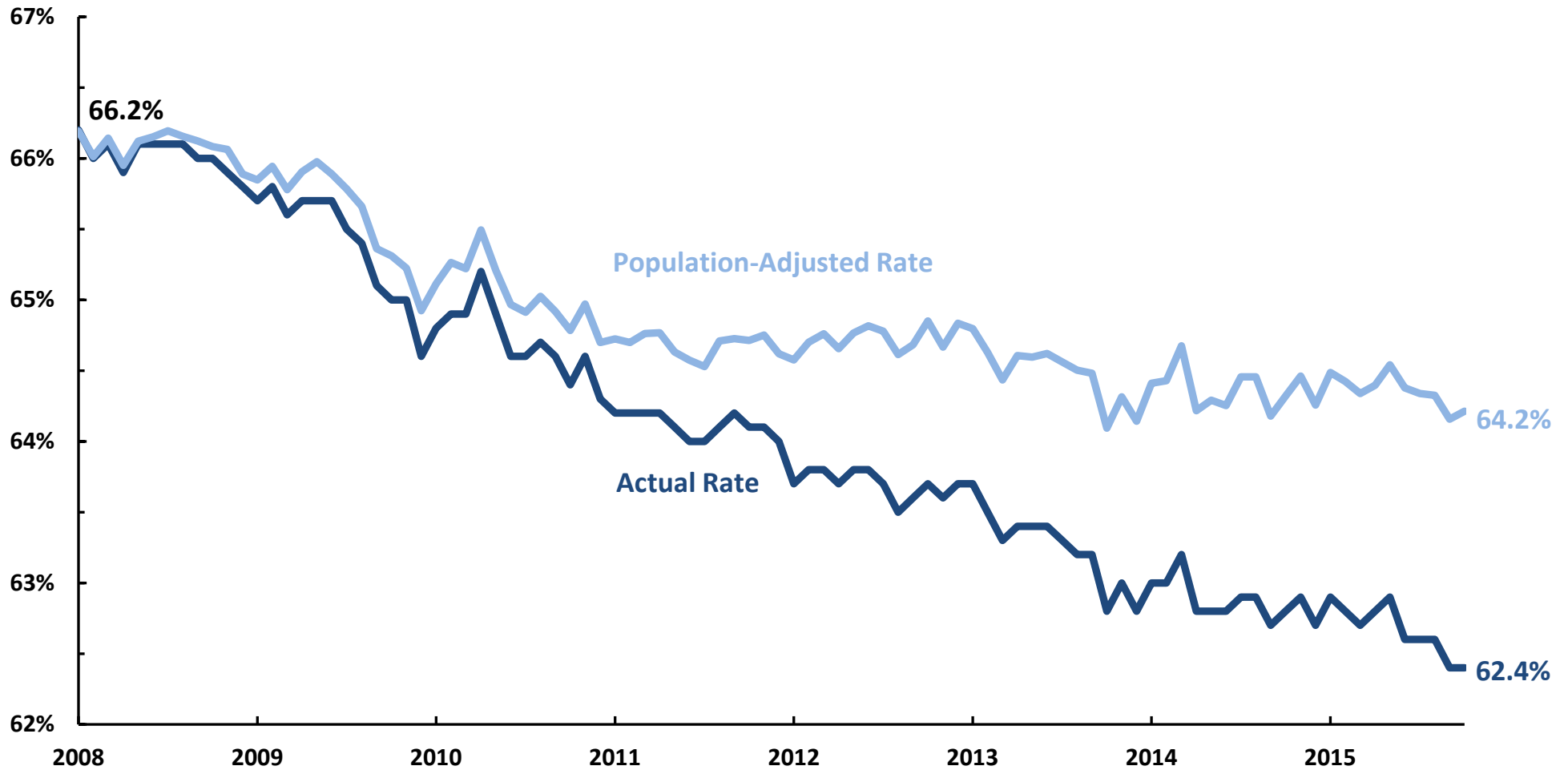
