

Even in 2017, women still face economic barriers. At the current rate of change, the gender wage gap will not close until 2059, according to the Institute for Women's Policy Research. Here are additional facts about women and the economy.



#### 1 WOMEN OF ALL RACES AND ETHNICITIES EARN LESS THAN WHITE MEN

Compared to white men, Asian women earn 84¢ on the dollar; white women earn 75¢ on the dollar; black women earn 63¢ on the dollar; and Latinas earn 54¢ on the dollar.



#### A MAJORITY OF WOMEN, 56.8%, PARTICIPATE IN THE LABOR FORCE AND CONTRIBUTE SUBSTANTIALLY TO FAMILY ECONOMIC SECURITY

In the typical (median) household working women with children contribute more than 40% of their family's total earnings.


WOMEN EARN THE MAJORITY OF ADVANCED DEGREES
