


Private-Sector Job Growth Continues in July

Net change in employment, January 2010 to July 2015



January 2006 to July 2015





Percent of the labor force unemployed by duration, January 2000 to July 2015



Black vs. White Unemployment





January 2000 to July 2015





12-month moving averages, January 2010 to July 2015


