This Week in Focus

This Wednesday at 2:30 pm (EST), the JEC will be hosting a hearing, "Building Blocks for Success: Investing in Early Childhood Education," where the committee will discuss the economic benefits of federal funding for child care and pre-K, and highlight the way states like New Mexico are moving the needle on providing affordable care for all families. The JEC released a report today on the same topics and are excited to be joined Wednesday by their esteemed witnesses, New Mexico House Speaker Javier Martínez and National Women's Law Center Vice President Melissa Boteach.

Last week, the JEC Dems analyzed the March jobs report which showed that the economy added a whopping 303,000 jobs in March and the unemployment rate ticked down to 3.8%, consistent with a strong and stable labor market. The JEC Dems also released reports on the economic, environmental, and health <u>benefits</u> of electrifying heavy-duty vehicles, strategies for employing <u>women</u> in the clean energy sector, and a <u>report</u> on the need to raise revenue to address the U.S. debt trajectory, now published in <u>Spanish</u>.

Economic Indicators This Week

Below are a series of economic indicators that will be released later this week, along with the consensus estimates from a group of professional forecasters about what the data point will be once it is reported. Wednesday, April 10th:

- Consumer Price Index: The consensus forecast is that both headline and core CPI rose by 0.3%.
- **FOMC Meeting Minutes:** The FOMC minutes are expected to reiterate the Fed's caution in policy decisions.

Thursday, April 11th:

- **Jobless Claims**: The consensus forecast for weekly jobless claims expects a decrease to **215k** from **221k**.
- **Producer Price Index**: The consensus forecast is for **PPI** to increase by **0.3%** and **core PPI** to increase by **0.2%**.

Friday, April 12th:

• **Consumer Sentiment**: The consensus forecast for the University of Michigan's Consumer Sentiment survey predicts a small decrease to **79** from **79.4**.

What to Read From the Think Tank World

- The Council of Economic Advisers (CEA) analyzed the jobs report for March, emphasizing how the jobs market has repeatedly beat expectations. The CEA also dug into the economics of the administration's action on student debt both for borrowers and the broader economy, finding it can help increase homeownership, promote entrepreneurship, ease stress and anxiety, lower delinquency rates on other debt, and improve credit scores.
- <u>The National Women's Law Center and Georgetown Center on Poverty and Inequality</u> released a brief offering a new, anti-racist vision for transforming the Child Care and Development Fund and advancing a more equitable child care system.
- <u>The Economic Policy Institute (EPI)</u> used macroeconomic indicators to demonstrate how economic performance is stronger when Democrats hold the White House.
- The Center for American Progress (CAP) released a 50-state scan of 2023 legislative action on K-12 work-based learning opportunities.
- <u>Liberty Street Economics at the Federal Reserve Bank of New York</u> estimated a new measure of aggregate physical climate risk using publicly available data to help find its impact in the financial market.
