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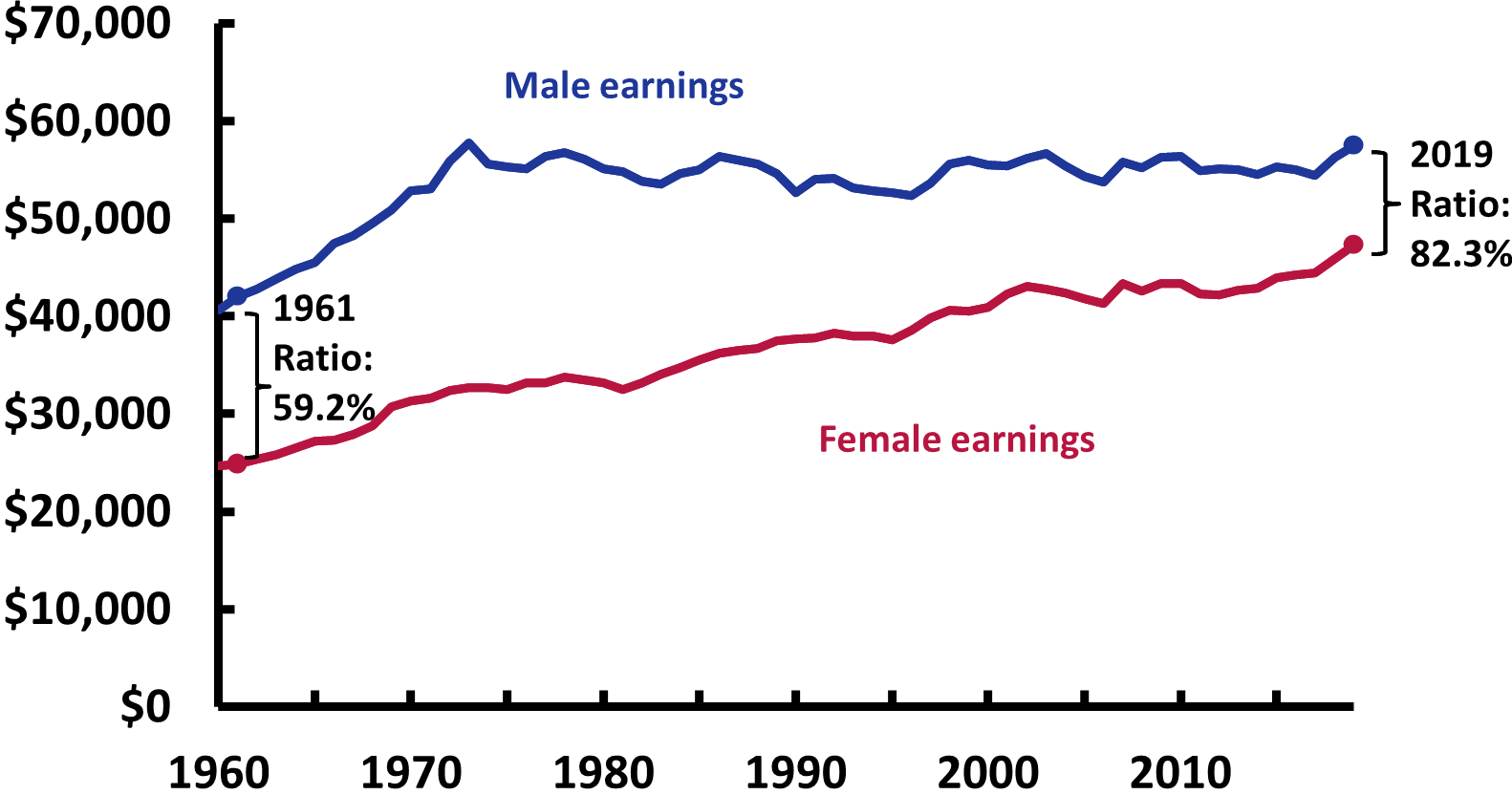

Median annual earnings for full-time, year-round workers



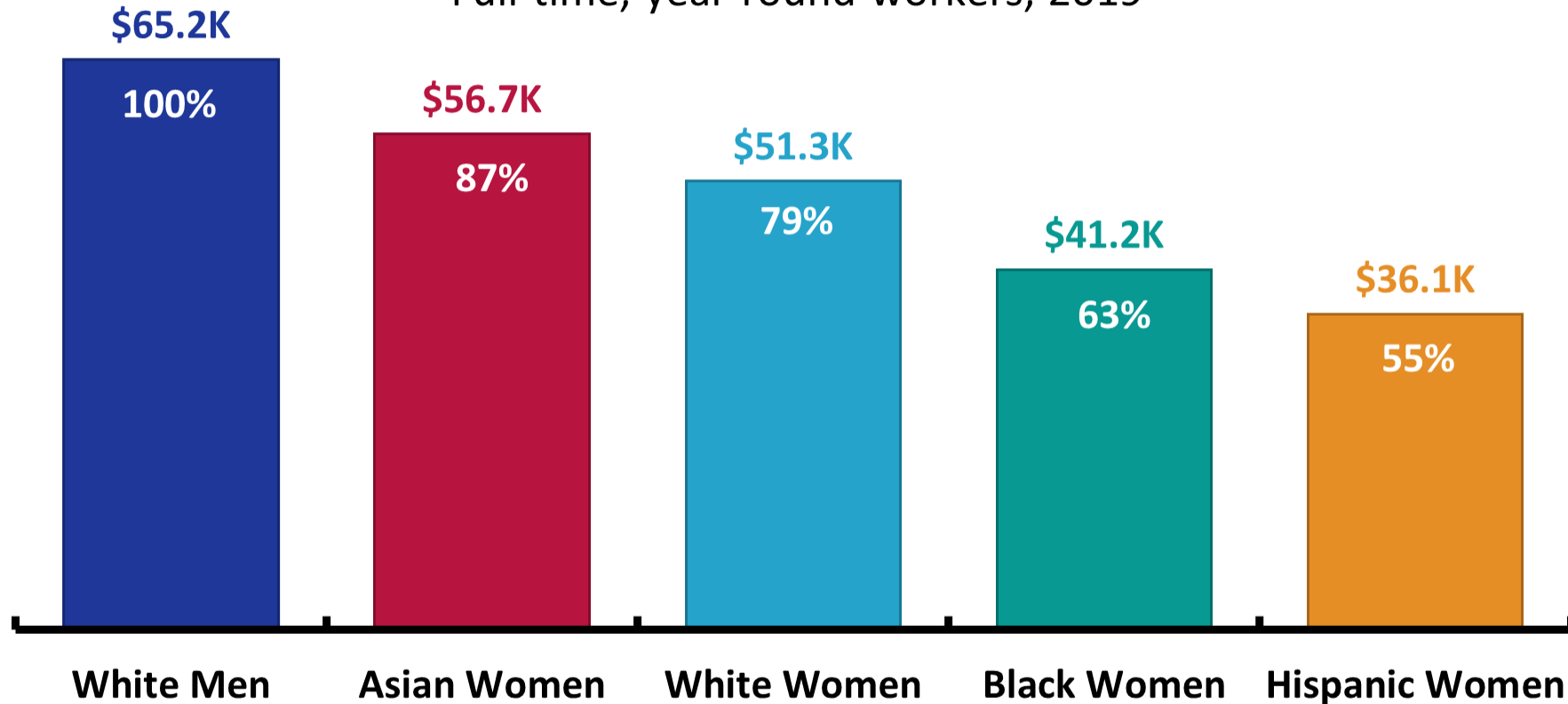

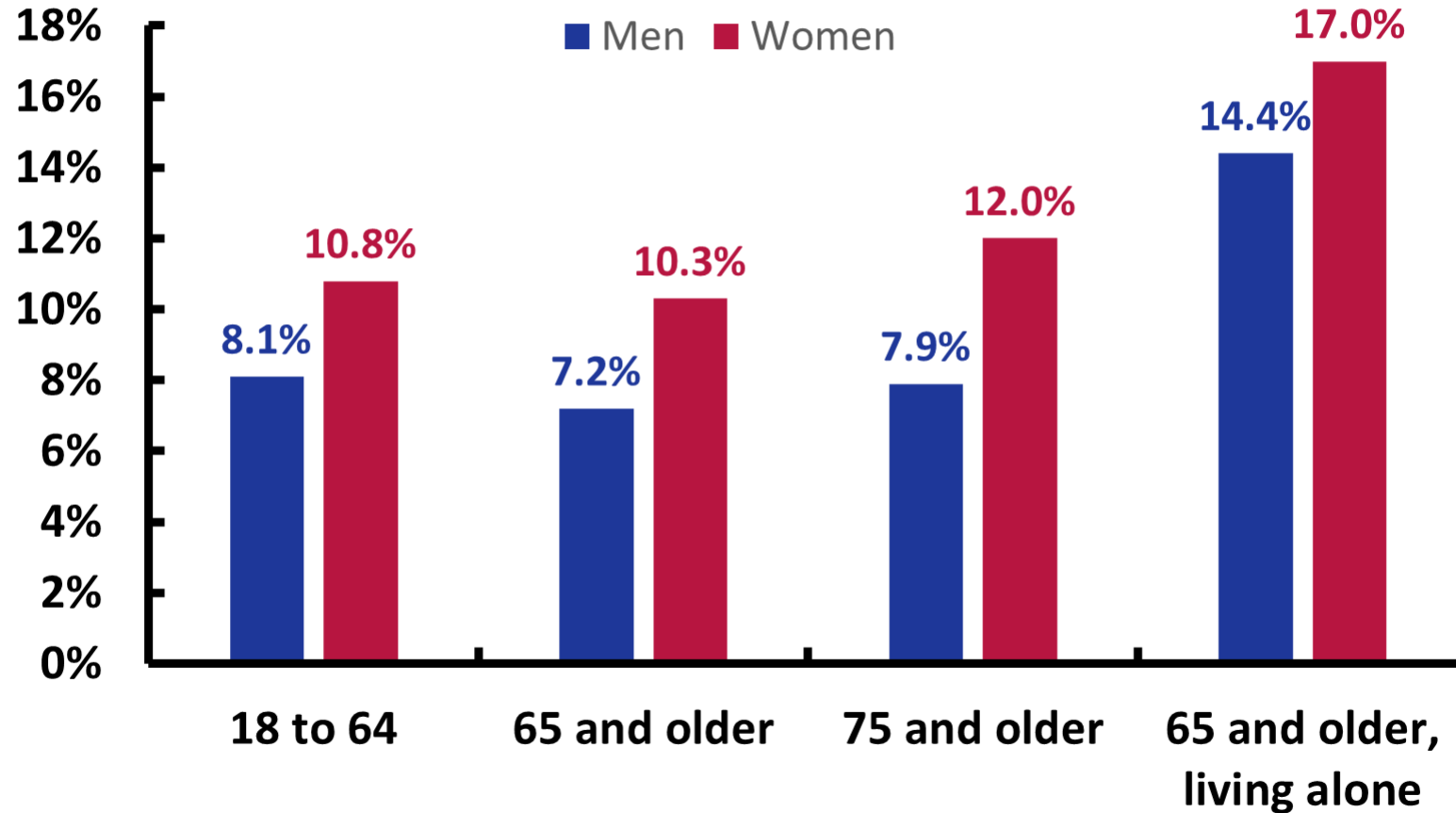

Percent in poverty by age and gender



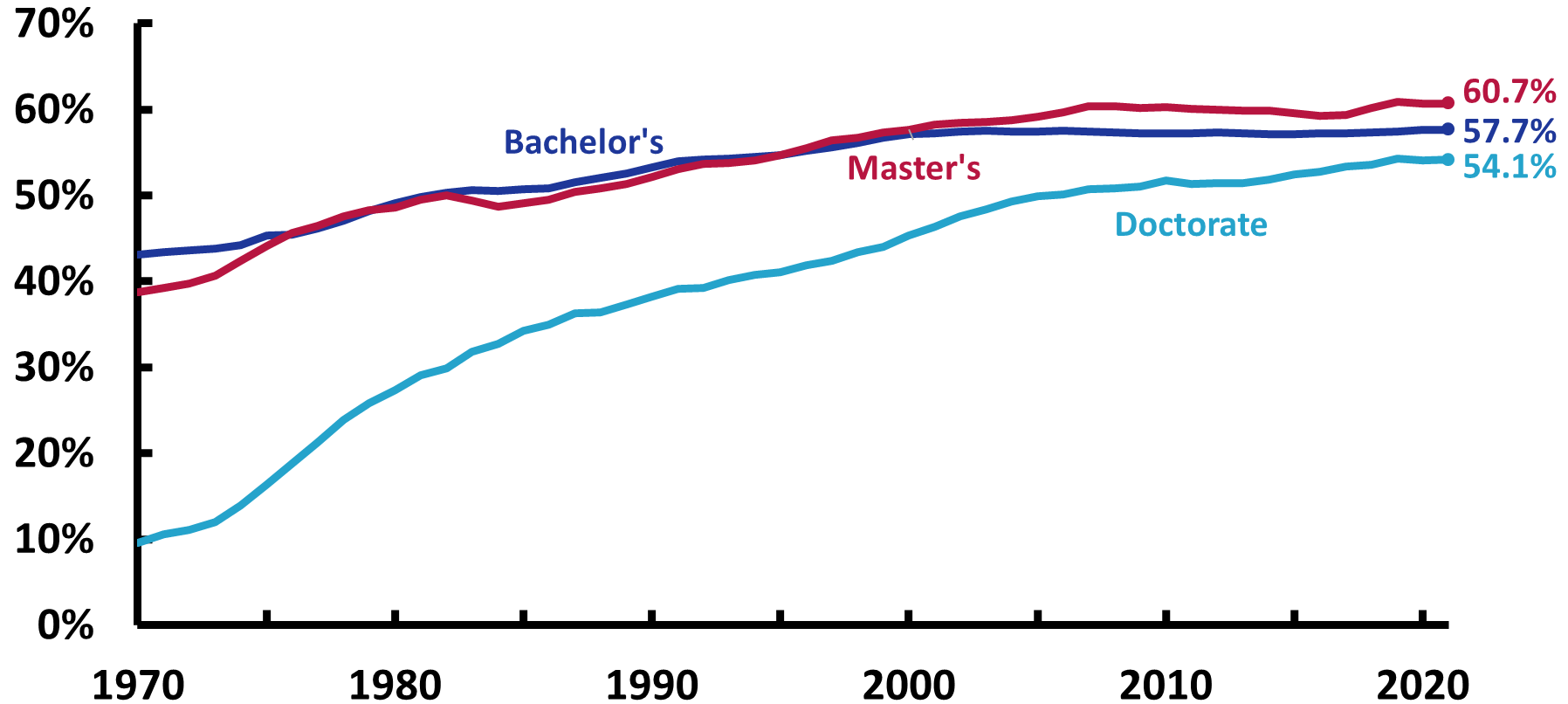

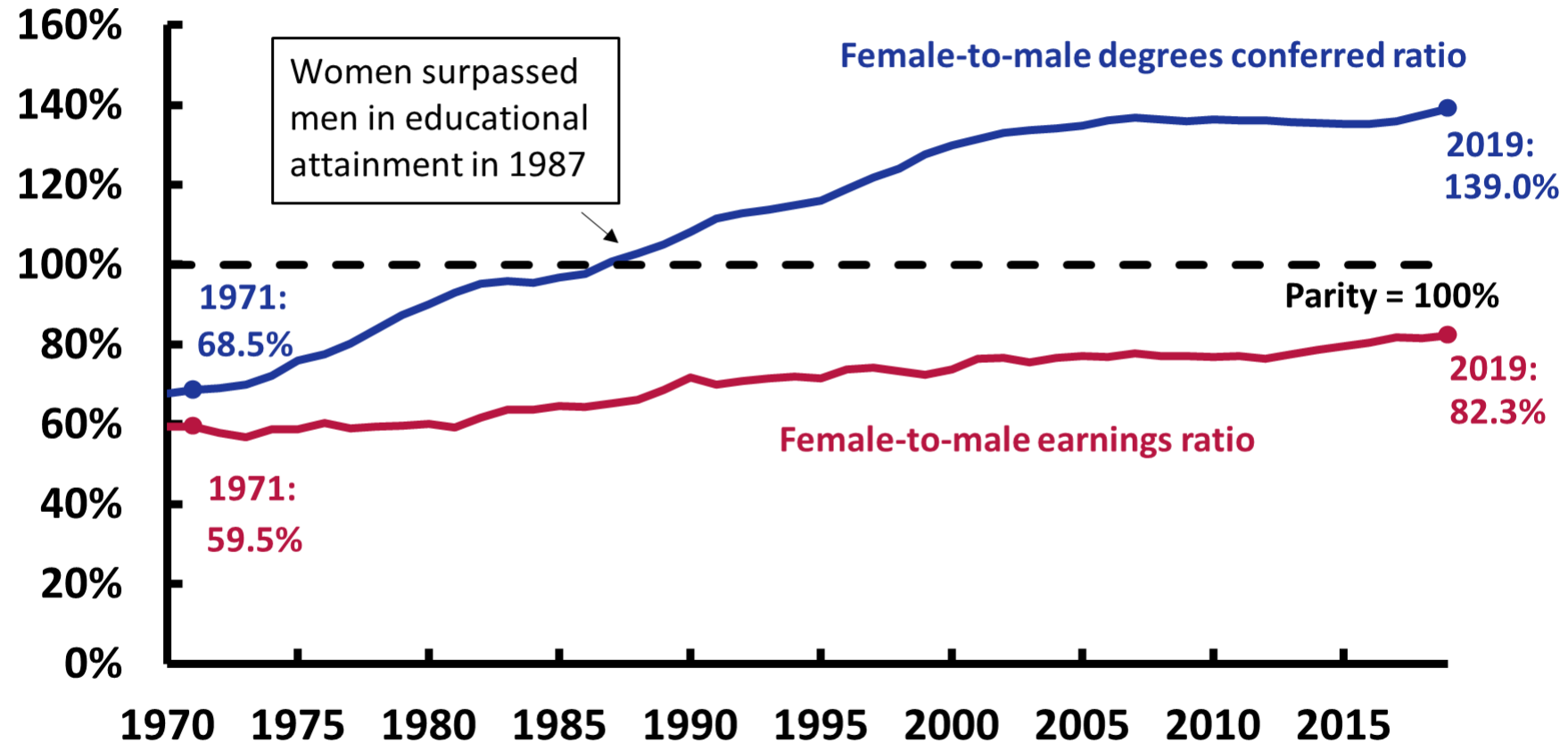
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Women Are More Highly Educated but Earn Less than Men

Female-to-male ratios for median annual earnings and post-secondary degrees

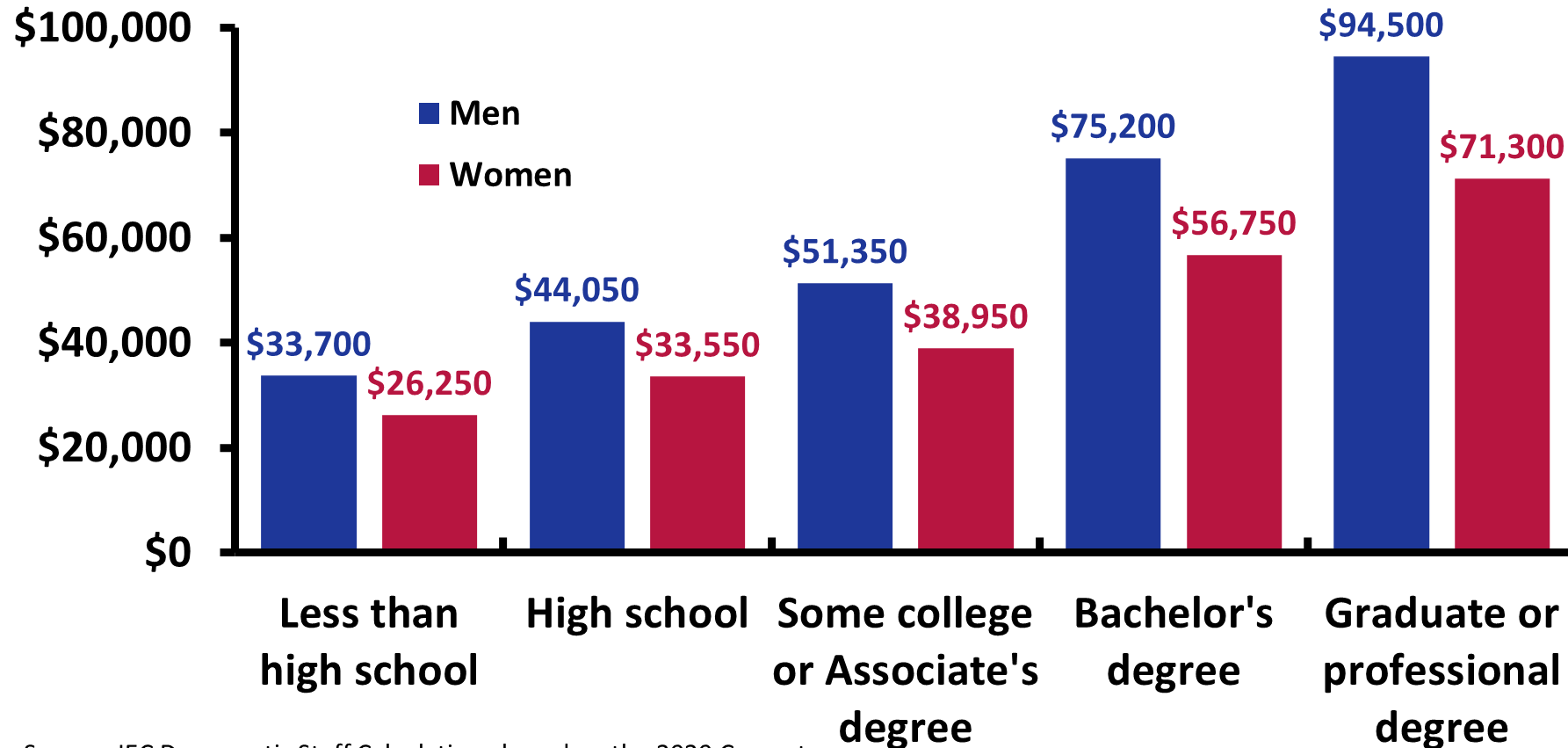

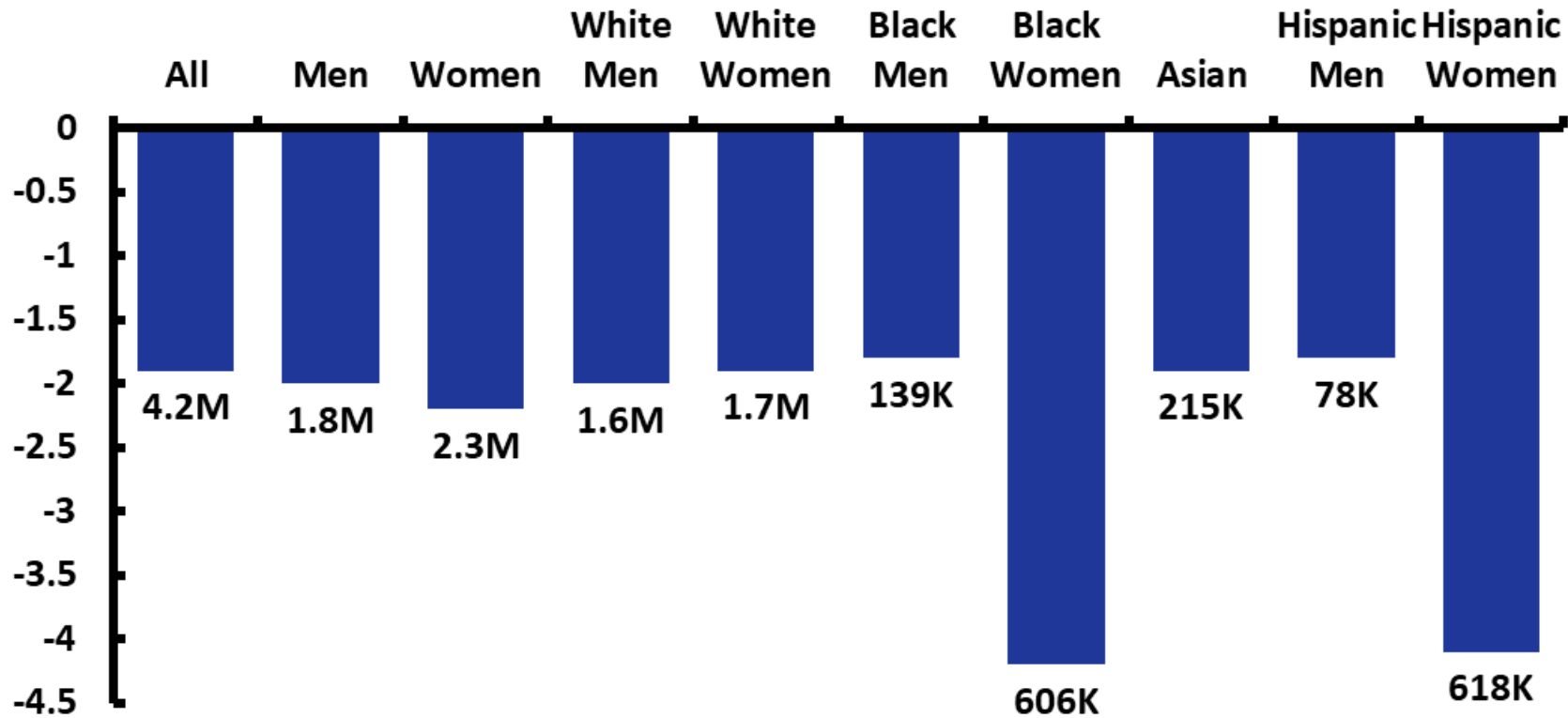

Change in labor force participation from February 2020 to February 2021

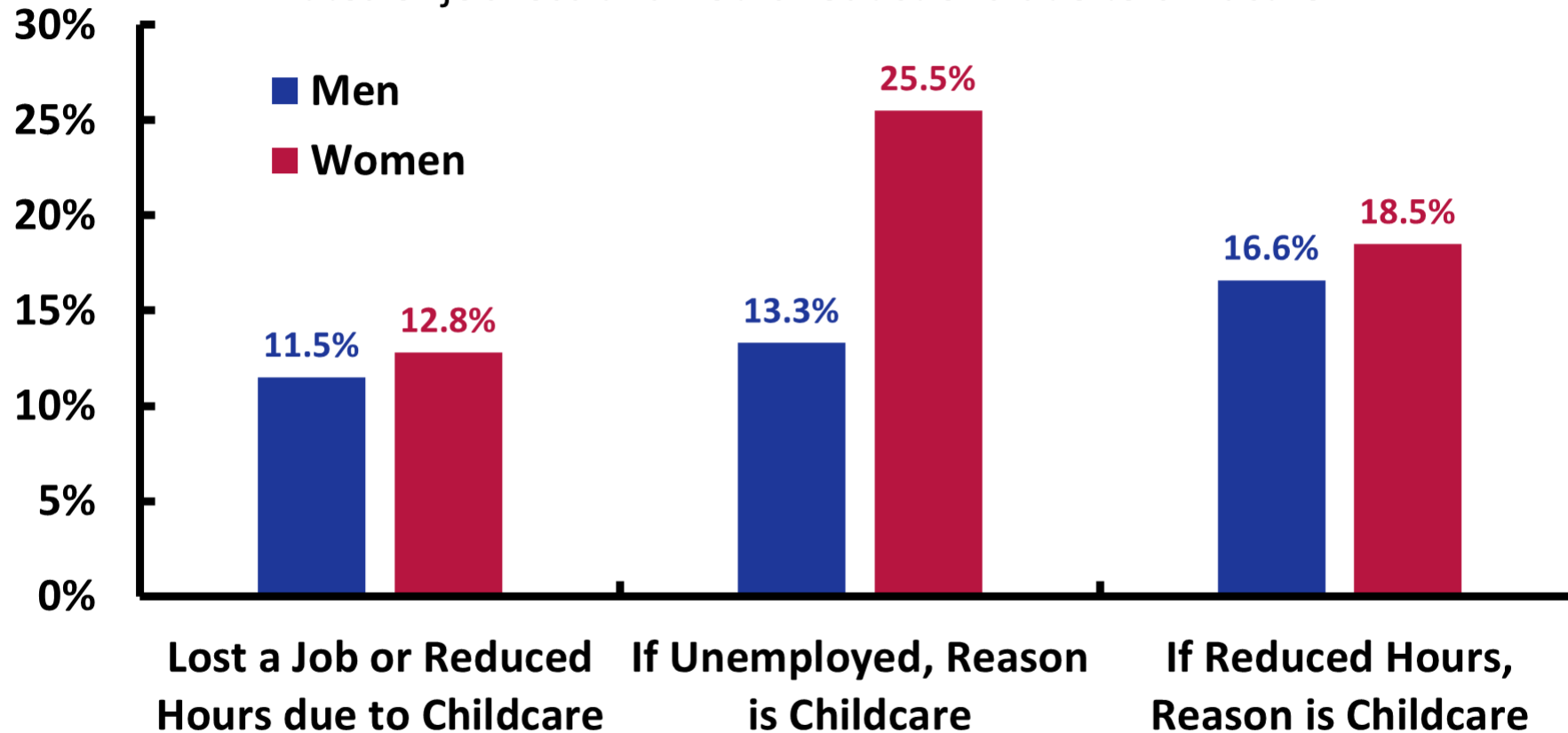
