Economic Snapshot of the States

Since taking office more than seven months ago, the Trump administration and Congressional Republicans have failed to provide a credible plan to create good paying jobs and increase wages for America's workers—it is evident in the August economic snapshot of states. The economic uncertainty created and fueled by this administration's unprecedented dysfunction, despite controlling two branches of government, is stalling what had been resurgent wage growth that reached 3.9 percent in November 2016 for the median U.S. worker.¹

Since President Trump took office and Republicans took control of Congress:

- U.S. employers gave notifications to lay off more than 171,000 workers, as companies closed plants and operations and shipped jobs offshore.
- Real hourly earnings since January 2017 fell in 25 states, while in 13 states earnings over the same period grew by less than one percent. Only five states recorded wage growth exceeding two percent.
- The share of families past due on their mortgage payments grew in nearly half of all states spanning the country.

Although the U.S. economy overall continues its expansion following the Great Recession and associated financial crisis, the recovery can look very different from state to state, and even county to county. The lion's share of economic gains are not only concentrated at the top of the income and wealth distribution, but also in small numbers of zip codes. While some parts of the country have surged ahead, millions of Americans in urban and rural communities alike endure a daily financial squeeze with recession-like job and wage conditions.

For most Americans, family financial well-being has little to do with the height of stock indices or overall GDP growth. The state-by-state snapshots track an array of metrics indicating local economic performance, families' economic security, how well states are preparing for the economic future with investments in people's health and learning, and the costs of living that feature regularly in kitchen table discussions.
