## District of Columbia Employment Situation Summary

## National Employment Data

- Since President Biden took office, $5,875,000$ jobs have been created nationwide, an average of 588,000 created each month.
- In the month of November, the latest for which national data are available, 210,000 jobs were created, and the unemployment rate dropped to $4.2 \%$, outperforming expectations and reaching a new pandemic-era low.
- The unemployment rate went down for adult men (4.0\%), adult women (4.0\%), white workers (3.7\%), Asian workers (3.8\%), Hispanic workers (5.2\%) and Black workers (6.7\%).


## State Employment Data

- Since President Biden took office, 25,300 jobs have been created in District of Columbia.
- In the month of November, the latest for which state-level data are available, 400 jobs were lost in District of Columbia.
