

United States Employment Snapshot

- In May, among the 50 states and the District of Columbia **unemployment fell in 13, rose in 17, and remained unchanged in 21.**
- The highest unemployment rate was 5.3 percent in **District of Columbia**, and the lowest was 2 percent in **North Dakota and South Dakota**. Nationally, the unemployment rate rose by 0.1 percentage point to 4 percent.
- In May, **payroll jobs rose in 42 states and fell in 9.** The largest payroll job percent increase was 0.9 percent in **Idaho**. The largest payroll job percent decline was 0.3 percent in **Minnesota**.

Arkansas Employment Snapshot

- In May, Arkansas lost 3,300 net payroll jobs and the unemployment rate remained unchanged at 3.4 percent. In the prior month, Arkansas added 3,000 net payroll jobs.
- Over the past 12 months, Arkansas added 16,200 net payroll jobs and the unemployment rate rose by 0.5 percentage points from 2.9 percent.
- Nationally, nonfarm payrolls **rose by 272,000 in May, or 0.2 percent.** Arkansas **is tied for 34th** in the nation for percentage gain in nonfarm payroll employment over the past 12 months.
- In May, **Arkansas's private sector lost 3,500 net private payroll jobs**, and over the past 12 months it added 13,500 private payroll jobs. In the prior month, Arkansas added 3,000 net private payroll jobs.
- In May, employment in Arkansas rose by 3,406, and over the past 12 months it rose by 8,502.
- Arkansas's labor force participation rate remained steady at 57.5 percent in May and is tied for 45th in the nation. In the past 12 months, the labor force participation rate has remained unchanged.
