

United States Employment Snapshot

- In May, among the 50 states and the District of Columbia unemployment fell in 13, rose in 17, and remained unchanged in 21.
- The highest unemployment rate was 5.3 percent in **District of Columbia**, and the lowest was 2 percent in **North Dakota and South Dakota**. Nationally, the unemployment rate rose by 0.1 percentage point to 4 percent.
- In May, **payroll jobs rose in 42 states and fell in 9.** The largest payroll job percent increase was 0.9 percent in **Idaho**. The largest payroll job percent decline was 0.3 percent in **Minnesota**.

Maryland Employment Snapshot

- In May, Maryland added 6,400 net payroll jobs and the unemployment rate rose by 0.1 percentage point to 2.7 percent. In the prior month, Maryland added 6,500 net payroll jobs.
- Over the past 12 months, Maryland added 6,800 net payroll jobs and the unemployment rate rose by 0.8 percentage points from 1.9 percent.
- Nationally, nonfarm payrolls **rose by 272,000 in May, or 0.2 percent.** Maryland **is tied for 49th** in the nation for percentage gain in nonfarm payroll employment over the past 12 months.
- In May, Maryland's private sector added 5,200 net private payroll jobs, and over the past 12 months it lost 7,100 private payroll jobs. In the prior month, Maryland added 3,500 net private payroll jobs.
- In May, employment in Maryland rose by 5,771, and over the past 12 months it fell by 17.
- Maryland's labor force participation rate rose to 65.3 percent in May from 65.2 percent and is tied for 14th in the
 nation. In the past 12 months, the labor force participation rate has risen by 0.2 percentage points.
