Maryland Employment Report

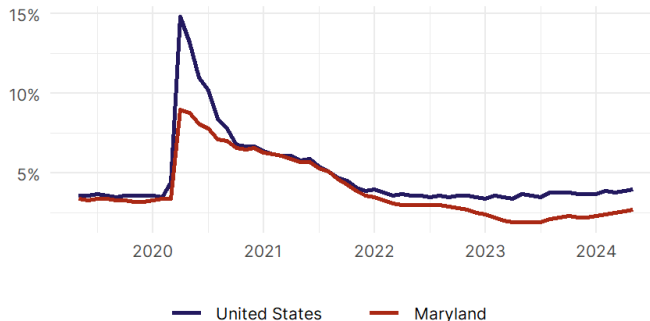
United States Employment Snapshot

- In May, among the 50 states and the District of Columbia **unemployment fell in 13, rose in 17, and remained unchanged in 21.**
- The highest unemployment rate was 5.3 percent in **District of Columbia**, and the lowest was 2 percent in **North Dakota and South Dakota**. Nationally, the unemployment rate rose by 0.1 percentage point to 4 percent.
- In May, **payroll jobs rose in 42 states and fell in 9.** The largest payroll job percent increase was 0.9 percent in **Idaho**. The largest payroll job percent decline was 0.3 percent in **Minnesota**.

Maryland Employment Snapshot

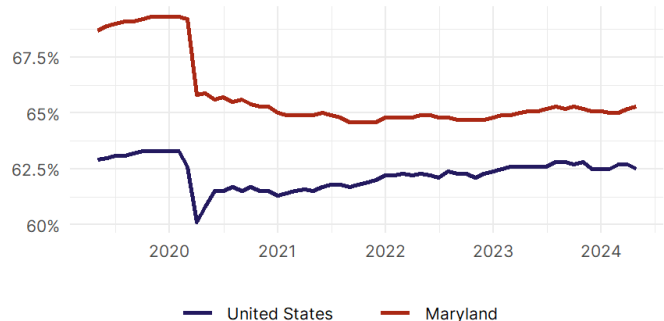
- In May, **Maryland added 6,400 net payroll jobs** and the **unemployment rate rose by 0.1 percentage point to 2.7 percent.** In the prior month, Maryland added 6,500 net payroll jobs.
- Over the past 12 months, **Maryland added 6,800 net payroll jobs** and the **unemployment rate rose by 0.8 percentage points from 1.9 percent.**
- Nationally, nonfarm payrolls **rose by 272,000 in May, or 0.2 percent.** Maryland **is tied for 49th** in the nation for percentage gain in nonfarm payroll employment over the past 12 months.
- In May, **Maryland's private sector added 5,200 net private payroll jobs**, and over the past 12 months it lost 7,100 private payroll jobs. In the prior month, Maryland added 3,500 net private payroll jobs.
- In May, employment in Maryland **rose by 5,771**, and over the past 12 months it fell by 17.
- **Maryland's labor force participation rate rose to 65.3 percent** in May from 65.2 percent and **is tied for 14th** in the nation. In the past 12 months, the labor force participation rate has risen by 0.2 percentage points.
