

## **United States** Employment Snapshot

- In May, among the 50 states and the District of Columbia unemployment fell in 13, rose in 17, and remained unchanged in 21.
- The highest unemployment rate was 5.3 percent in **District of Columbia**, and the lowest was 2 percent in **North Dakota and South Dakota**. Nationally, the unemployment rate rose by 0.1 percentage point to 4 percent.
- In May, **payroll jobs rose in 42 states and fell in 9.** The largest payroll job percent increase was 0.9 percent in **Idaho**. The largest payroll job percent decline was 0.3 percent in **Minnesota**.

## **Michigan** Employment Snapshot

- In May, **Michigan added 7,900 net payroll jobs** and the **unemployment rate remained unchanged at 3.9 percent**. In the prior month, Michigan added 16,500 net payroll jobs.
- Over the past 12 months, **Michigan added 41,400 net payroll jobs** and the **unemployment rate rose by 0.3** percentage points from **3.6** percent.
- Nationally, nonfarm payrolls **rose by 272,000 in May, or 0.2 percent.** Michigan **is tied for 42nd** in the nation for percentage gain in nonfarm payroll employment over the past 12 months.
- In May, **Michigan's private sector added 7,300 net private payroll jobs**, and over the past 12 months it added 24,200 private payroll jobs. In the prior month, Michigan added 15,800 net private payroll jobs.
- In May, employment in Michigan rose by 1,265, and over the past 12 months it rose by 36,982.
- Michigan's labor force participation rate remained steady at 62.3 percent in May and ranks 32nd in the nation. In the past 12 months, the labor force participation rate has risen by 0.4 percentage points.
