

United States Employment Snapshot

- In May, among the 50 states and the District of Columbia **unemployment fell in 13, rose in 17, and remained unchanged in 21.**
- The highest unemployment rate was 5.3 percent in **District of Columbia**, and the lowest was 2 percent in **North Dakota and South Dakota**. Nationally, the unemployment rate rose by 0.1 percentage point to 4 percent.
- In May, **payroll jobs rose in 42 states and fell in 9.** The largest payroll job percent increase was 0.9 percent in **Idaho**. The largest payroll job percent decline was 0.3 percent in **Minnesota**.

New York Employment Snapshot

- In May, New York added 21,700 net payroll jobs and the unemployment rate remained unchanged at 4.2 percent. In the prior month, New York added 17,700 net payroll jobs.
- Over the past 12 months, New York added 153,800 net payroll jobs and the unemployment rate rose by 0.3 percentage points from 3.9 percent.
- Nationally, nonfarm payrolls **rose by 272,000 in May, or 0.2 percent**. New York **is tied for 22nd** in the nation for percentage gain in nonfarm payroll employment over the past 12 months.
- In May, **New York's private sector added 15,800 net private payroll jobs**, and over the past 12 months it added 122,800 private payroll jobs. In the prior month, New York added 15,300 net private payroll jobs.
- In May, employment in New York fell by 7,148, and over the past 12 months it fell by 20,203.
- New York's labor force participation rate remained steady at 61.3 percent in May and ranks 37th in the nation. In the past 12 months, the labor force participation rate has risen by 0.2 percentage points.
