

United States Employment Snapshot

- In May, among the 50 states and the District of Columbia unemployment fell in 13, rose in 17, and remained unchanged in 21.
- The highest unemployment rate was 5.3 percent in **District of Columbia**, and the lowest was 2 percent in **North Dakota and South Dakota**. Nationally, the unemployment rate rose by 0.1 percentage point to 4 percent.
- In May, **payroll jobs rose in 42 states and fell in 9.** The largest payroll job percent increase was 0.9 percent in **Idaho**. The largest payroll job percent decline was 0.3 percent in **Minnesota**.

Ohio Employment Snapshot

- In May, Ohio added 21,200 net payroll jobs and the unemployment rate rose by 0.2 percentage point to 4.2 percent. In the prior month, Ohio added 1,300 net payroll jobs.
- Over the past 12 months, Ohio added 49,500 net payroll jobs and the unemployment rate rose by 0.9 percentage points from 3.3 percent.
- Nationally, nonfarm payrolls **rose by 272,000 in May, or 0.2 percent.** Ohio **is tied for 42nd** in the nation for percentage gain in nonfarm payroll employment over the past 12 months.
- In May, **Ohio's private sector added 22,900 net private payroll jobs**, and over the past 12 months it added 51,400 private payroll jobs. In the prior month, Ohio added 3,400 net private payroll jobs.
- In May, employment in Ohio fell by 4,246, and over the past 12 months it fell by 23,470.
- Ohio's labor force participation rate rose to 61.9 percent in May from 61.8 percent and ranks 35th in the nation. In the past 12 months, the labor force participation rate has remained unchanged.
