

United States Employment Snapshot

- In May, among the 50 states and the District of Columbia unemployment fell in 13, rose in 17, and remained unchanged in 21.
- The highest unemployment rate was 5.3 percent in **District of Columbia**, and the lowest was 2 percent in **North Dakota and South Dakota**. Nationally, the unemployment rate rose by 0.1 percentage point to 4 percent.
- In May, **payroll jobs rose in 42 states and fell in 9.** The largest payroll job percent increase was 0.9 percent in **Idaho**. The largest payroll job percent decline was 0.3 percent in **Minnesota**.

West Virginia Employment Snapshot

- In May, West Virginia added 3,200 net payroll jobs and the unemployment rate fell by 0.1 percentage point to 4.2 percent. In the prior month, West Virginia lost 1,400 net payroll jobs.
- Over the past 12 months, **West Virginia added 13,200 net payroll jobs** and the **unemployment rate rose by 0.6** percentage points from **3.6** percent.
- Nationally, nonfarm payrolls **rose by 272,000 in May, or 0.2 percent.** West Virginia **is tied for 14th** in the nation for percentage gain in nonfarm payroll employment over the past 12 months.
- In May, **West Virginia's private sector added 400 net private payroll jobs**, and over the past 12 months it added 6,900 private payroll jobs. In the prior month, West Virginia lost 500 net private payroll jobs.
- In May, employment in West Virginia rose by 114, and over the past 12 months it rose by 1,307.
- West Virginia's labor force participation rate fell to 55.1 percent in May from 55.2 percent and ranks 50th in the
 nation. In the past 12 months, the labor force participation rate has risen by 0.3 percentage points.
