Idaho Employment Update





United States Employment Snapshot

- In October, among the 50 states and the District of Columbia **unemployment fell in 8, rose in 22, and remained unchanged in 21.**
- The highest unemployment rate was 5.7 percent in **District of Columbia and Nevada**, and the lowest was 1.9 percent in **South Dakota**. Nationally, the unemployment rate remained unchanged in October.
- In October, **payroll jobs rose in 21 states and fell in 30.** The largest payroll job percent increase was 0.4 percent in **Idaho**. The largest payroll job percent decline was 1 percent in **Washington**.

Idaho Employment Snapshot

- In October, Idaho added 3,800 net payroll jobs and the unemployment rate rose by 0.1 percentage point to 3.7 percent. In the prior month, Idaho added 4,300 net payroll jobs.
- Over the past 12 months, Idaho added 26,300 net payroll jobs and the unemployment rate rose by 0.4 percentage points from 3.3 percent.
- Nationally, nonfarm payrolls rose by 12,000 in October, or 0 percent. Idaho ranks 1st in the nation for percentage gain in nonfarm payroll employment over the past 12 months.
- In October, **Idaho's private sector added 3,000 net private payroll jobs**, and over the past 12 months it added 20,100 private payroll jobs. In the prior month, Idaho added 3,800 net private payroll jobs.
- In October, employment in Idaho rose by 3,037, and over the past 12 months it rose by 21,556.
- Idaho's labor force participation rate rose to 63.3 percent in October from 63.2 percent and ranks 23rd in the nation. In the past 12 months, the labor force participation rate has risen by 0.4 percentage points.
