## New York Employment Update

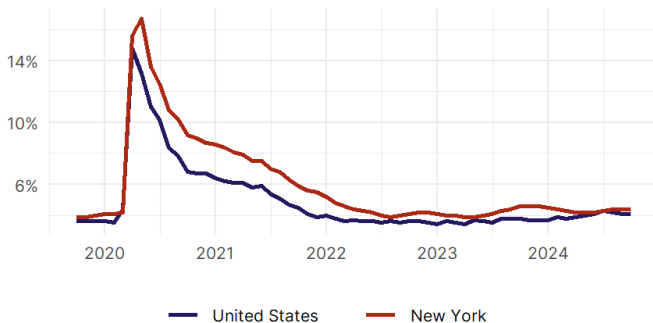
### United States Employment Snapshot

- In October, among the 50 states and the District of Columbia **unemployment fell in 8, rose in 22, and remained unchanged in 21.**
- The highest unemployment rate was 5.7 percent in **District of Columbia and Nevada**, and the lowest was 1.9 percent in **South Dakota**. Nationally, the unemployment rate remained unchanged in October.
- In October, **payroll jobs rose in 21 states and fell in 30.** The largest payroll job percent increase was 0.4 percent in **Idaho**. The largest payroll job percent decline was 1 percent in **Washington**.

### New York Employment Snapshot

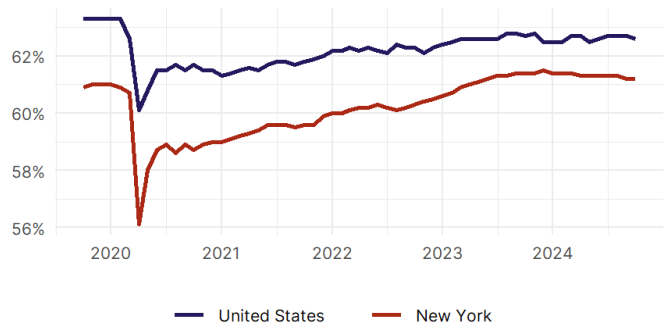
- In October, **New York lost 10,900 net payroll jobs** and the **unemployment rate remained unchanged at 4.4 percent.** In the prior month, New York lost 1,300 net payroll jobs.
- Over the past 12 months, **New York added 133,600 net payroll jobs** and the **unemployment rate fell by 0.2 percentage points from 4.6 percent.**
- Nationally, nonfarm payrolls **rose by 12,000 in October, or 0 percent.** New York **is tied for 23rd** in the nation for percentage gain in nonfarm payroll employment over the past 12 months.
- In October, **New York's private sector lost 800 net private payroll jobs**, and over the past 12 months it added 114,700 private payroll jobs. In the prior month, New York lost 3,400 net private payroll jobs.
- In October, employment in New York **fell by 2,310**, and over the past 12 months it fell by 28,742.
- **New York's labor force participation rate remained steady at 61.2 percent** in October and **ranks 37th** in the nation. In the past 12 months, the labor force participation rate has fallen by 0.2 percentage points.
