Monthly Employment Update

Employment Situation


February 2025 | Released March 07, 2025

From January 2025 to February 2025:

- Nonfarm payroll employment increased by 151K.
 - Private sector payroll employment increased by 140K
 - Government payroll employment increased by 11K.
- The headline unemployment rate (U-3) increased by 0.1 percentage points to 4.1 percent.
 - The broadest measure of unemployment (U-6, which adds underemployment to unemployment), increased by 0.5 percentage points to 8.0 percent.
- The labor force participation rate (LFPR) decreased by 0.2 percentage points to 62.4 percent.


From February 2024 to February 2025:


- For all employees on private nonfarm payrolls:
 - Average nominal weekly earnings increased by 3.42 percent.
 - Average nominal hourly earnings increased by 4.02 percent.
- For production and nonsupervisory employees on private nonfarm payrolls:
 - o Average nominal weekly earnings increased by 3.8 percent.
 - Average nominal hourly earnings increased by 4.11 percent.



From January 2025 to February 2025:

- The best performing sectors were **Education and Health Services** (+73K) and **Trade, Transportation, and Utilities** (+21K).
- The worst performing sectors were Leisure and Hospitality (-16K) and Retail Trade (-6.3K).





From February 2024 to February 2025:

- The best performing sectors were Education and Health Services (+943K) and Government (+391K).
- The worst performing sectors were Professional and Business Services (-88K) and Manufacturing (-88K).
